




Congratulations to our 2025 graduates! We can't wait to see what you will accomplish as you launch into the next chapter of your lives.



University Highlight



If your summer travel plans include a visit to Yellowstone National Park, it might be worth brushing up on your <u>seismology</u>. Researchers from the **University of Utah** and the University of New Mexico have concluded that the long-debated question of a potential Yellowstone volcano eruption is now moot. By generating 110 small, controlled "earthquakes" throughout the park, the team collected data using seismometers and produced high-resolution images of the subsurface. These findings offer new insights into the geological activity beneath Yellowstone.
